DAY 1-December 1: Arrive in Nashville, Tennessee

Optional Nashville Scholars Walk - 11 km, rated 2A

Travelers arrive from across the country today into Nashville, Tennessee, affectionately known as "Music City, USA". We rendezvous at our hotel near Opryland, where we begin a 7-day and 6-night Country Christmas celebration spanning 3 states. Following a get-acquainted orientation this evening, feel free to explore the dazzling Christmas sights and sounds of Opryland Hotel.

Optional Nashville Bonus Day: Travelers how opt to arrive a day early, November 30, are invited to join us for a few high quality bonus activities. We start our morning with a walk in Nashville featuring the campuses of Vanderbilt and Belmont Universities, and a stroll down Nashville's famous Music Row to view a full scale replica of the Parthenon.

Our coach then takes us down the road for a Christmas Tour at historic Belle Meade Plantation, one of America's premier thoroughbred horse farms.

Estimated price: \$95 per person including guide service, guided walks with walk credit, entrance to Belle Meade Plantation, and bus service for the day.

NOTE: Travelers who arrive a day early, on November 30, are also invited to join us on an excursion inside the world of holiday-themed ice sculptures inside the Opryland Hotel. Price TBA

DAY 2-December 2: Activities in Nashville (B)

Nashville Capitol Walk - 12 km, rated 3A

Our second morning in Nashville begins with a walk focusing on the Tennessee state capitol, Bicentennial Mall, and historic Ryman Auditorium.

After a lunch stop, we look forward to presidential treatment during a Holiday Tour at the Hermitage, home of our seventh commander-in-chief, Andrew Jackson.

Enjoy dinner on your own this evening at one of the area's numerous restaurants. Also consider imbibing the marvelous Christmas ambiance of Opryland Hotel, using your included tickets to ride the indoor Delta Riverboats.

DAY 3-December 3: Activities in Mammoth Cave National Park, Kentucky (B)

Mammoth Cave Walk - 10 km, rated 2B

A short drive into Kentucky this morning connects us with the largest subterranean wonderland on the planet, Mammoth Cave National Park.

Prepare for spectacular natural sights as we embark on an underground/above ground walk. Witness the famous "Frozen Niagara" cave formation as well as numerous sinkholes, disappearing streams, and springs common throughout Kentucky's karst landscape.

Be filled with yuletide cheer as we participate in the annual Cave Sing and Storytelling event, a unique and memorable Christmas tradition dating back to 1883 that takes place only one day each year in the decorated and candlelit chambers of Mammoth Cave.

After our time in the Bluegrass State, we return to Nashville for a little down time, or more Opryland exploration.

DAY 4-December 4: Nashville - Chattanooga (B)

Chattanooga Downtown River Walk - 10 km, rated 2A

Today we shuffle down the tracks a couple of hours to charming Chattanooga, enjoying a downtown walk that features the Chattanooga Choo Choo and Walnut Street Bridge, the country's longest pedestrian bridge.

During your free time this afternoon, you may want to dive in to the fascinating environment of the world-class Tennessee Aquarium (optional).

This evening, we receive a little geological inspiration in our third state, Georgia, as we explore Rock City, a marvel of nature featuring massive ancient rock formations, gardens, and a wonderful display of Christmas lights.

DAY 5-December 5: Activities in Chattanooga (BD)

Lookout Mountain/Ruby Falls Walk - 10 km, rated 2C

After a brief drive back into the Peach State, we navigate the scenic and historic footpaths of Lookout Mountain during a combination Georgia/ Tennessee walk. Along the way, we discover the Civil War history of "The Battle Above the Clouds" and experience "America's Most Amazing Mile" as we descend down the 72.7% grade of Chattanooga's Incline Railway.

We then soak up more Christmas ambiance at impressive, 145 foot tall Ruby Falls, one of the largest underground waterfalls open to the public.

A fitting finish to our day comes at a Farewell Dinner at our Chattanooga hotel.

DAY 6-December 6: Depart from Nashville (B)

Following breakfast at our hotel, we reminisce together on our coach ride back to the Nashville airport for flights homeward.

Full of Christmas cheer and warm memories of our 3-state holiday extravaganza, we hope 'Yule' be back to join us for a future Adventure real soon!

What's a Classic Curated Tour?

With help from local experts and walking guides, these itineraries are hand-crafted with extensive on-site planning by WAI tour planners.

When planning Classic Curated Tours, our objective is to capture the essence of a destination-the history, culture, and natural wonders unique to that part of the world. We then build activities and walks that take us inside these characteristics.

Yes, these tours are educational, but they are also interactive and immersive; walking gets us off the bus and penetrates local cultures to not only see, but touch, smell, and feel these special spaces.

Along the way, interactions with locals amplify the experience as they share insights into the magic of that particular location.

Walk Ratings

We generally walk at a pace of 2 to 3 miles per hour. Several walks on this trip are oriented more towards education, and therefore take longer due to stops for guide commentary. Nature walks, on the other hand, generally continue at a steadier pace because we're stopping less to talk.

In most cases, we are not "strolling." We are walking at a relaxed but steady pace. Your

experience will be significantly affected by your level of physical fitness. If not walking regularly at home, we strongly recommend that you make a priority of "training" beforehand to both enjoy the trip and avoid medical issues due to overexertion. We have adopted a walk difficulty rating system which contains a numeric indicator for trail incline and an alpha indicator for trail terrain. The explanation for this system is presented on the table below:

INCLINE

- 1. Minimal hills or stair climbing. Cumulative elevation gain: <200 feet.
- 2. Some moderate hills and stair climbing. Cumulative elevation gain: 200-1000 feet.
- 3. Some significant hill or stair climbing. Cumulative elevation gain: 1000-2000 feet.

TERRAIN

- A. Almost entirely on pavement.
- B. A significant part of the route is on well-groomed trails with very few obstacles.

C. A significant part of the route is on somewhat difficult terrain (rocky / rooted paths or soft sand).

How is Airfare Arranged?

Our official start point is our hotel in Nashville, Tennessee. The nearest airport is Nashville International Airport (airport code BNA). The official finish point of the tour is the Nashville International Airport.

We recommend that you contact Laura Pfahler, the travel agent we work with, to help book your flight arrangements. In this age of airfare complications and airport uncertainty, using a travel agent is a good investment! This refund policy contains one exclusion. Many suppliers require non-refundable deposits as a condition of booking services. Though it is rare, unforeseen circumstances can force us to cancel a tour. In cases where supplier's non-refundable policies are imposed, WAI attempts to retrieve as much of these deposits as possible but cannot guarantee a 100% refund. In cases where full refunds cannot be obtained for a cancelled tour, we will do our best to transfer unrefunded money as traveler credits to be applied to a future tour to that destination.
