Skogafoss Falls

While most tourists stay below to gawk at its power, we climbed to an upper viewpoint and proceeded nearly 2 km upstream past several hidden, ice-riddled cascades that were far from the tourist throngs. It was absolutely gorgeous! Donning crampons on our feet, the

walking wasn't terribly difficult or threatening.



### Fjadrargljúfur Canyon

In the afternoon, just before the sun set (at 3:30 p.m.), we ventured to Fjadrargljúfur for a short and sweet stroll up a dramatically and deeply carved canyon. We may not use this walk in the winter as it was a bit more difficult than we had hoped.
